Nature Nanaimo is excited to announce our April meeting which will be both "in-person" and available via zoom. The feature presentation will be . . .

"Underwater Citizen Science in the Salish Sea" with Tom Hlavac

SCUBA technology has made participation in underwater citizen science possible for almost anyone. In British Columbia, the recreational dive community



has recently driven increased protection of valuable fish habitat and important marine species. Locally, recreational divers participate in citizen science activities such as lingcod egg mass and rockfish surveys, and collecting of research grade observations of marine species.

Tom will share knowledge on the accessibility of underwater exploration for the average citizen, recent and current recreational dive community citizen science activities, and marine species observed by divers in the Nanaimo region.

Biography: Tom has been a SCUBA diver since 1978. Tom has collected aquarium specimens and harvested marine species as a commercial diver prior to his career as a fishery officer from 1984 to 2017 with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO). While with DFO, Tom participated in dive activities such as underwater evidence collection, habitat protection monitoring, and stock assessment. Tom served as fisheries coordinator with INTERPOL's Environmental Security program from 2017 to 2020, leading INTERPOL's Global Fisheries Enforcement team.

Nature Nanaimo is excited to be offering public nature walks around Buttertubs Marsh this summer - from May-August!

As you know - part of Nature Nanaimo's mission is to educate the public about our natural environment.

What better way to help us accomplish our mission than for you to **volunteer just one or two mornings this summer** helping us by leading a tour.

About the tours:

These will be morning walks around the marsh - once a week - on alternating Saturdays and Sundays. Tours will be pitched at an introductory level. Each walk will be approximately 1.5 hours, starting at 9:30 AM. We are expecting between 6-12 participants per volunteer on each walk.

Each tour will have a simple theme such as:

"Discovering Nature at Buttertubs Marsh" (this will be our most frequent theme and one that anyone will be able to lead)

"Birds of Buttertubs Marsh"

"Aquatic Life of Buttertubs Marsh"

"Nature Photography at Buttertubs Marsh - for Beginners"

"Plants of Buttertubs Marsh"

Volunteers:

- First and foremost, will be ambassadors for nature simply willing to share their enjoyment of Buttertubs marsh.
- Will meet and welcome the participants and hand out Buttertubs "guide booklets" and lead the walk around the marsh.
- Will be provided with a "script" to follow so for most walks volunteers will NOT require
 any specialized knowledge you will simply be observing and highlighting the key
 features in the marsh that match the highlighted features of the guide booklet for
 example pointing out the painted turtles basking log and their egg-laying locations while
 noting the corresponding descriptions/information in the guide booklet.
- Will have an opportunity to "train" with other members ahead of time so you will know
 where key features are located and how they correspond to the information in the guide
 booklets.
- ONLY NEED TO COMMIT to 2 HOURS this entire summer! You can volunteer to do as few or as many walks as you like!

This spring's lecture series mainly focuses on the many varied aspects of climate change research and delve into topics such as investigating snowpack in Coastal BC, water resource management on Vancouver Island, tracking past shifts in sea levels and changes to wildlife.
